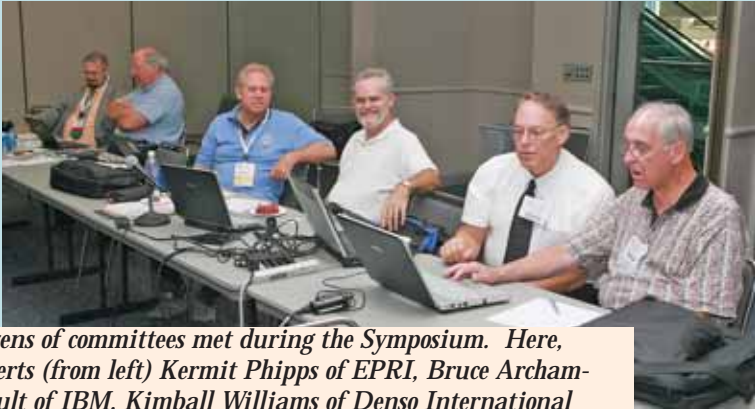


Scenes from the 2008 IEEE International Symposium on EMC

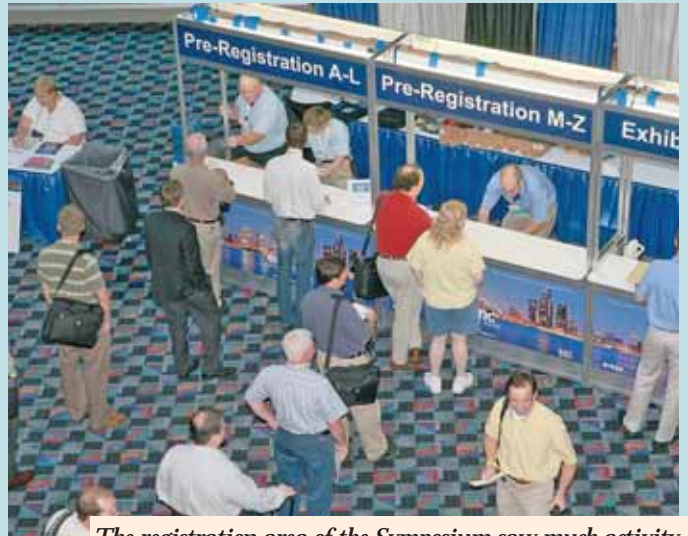

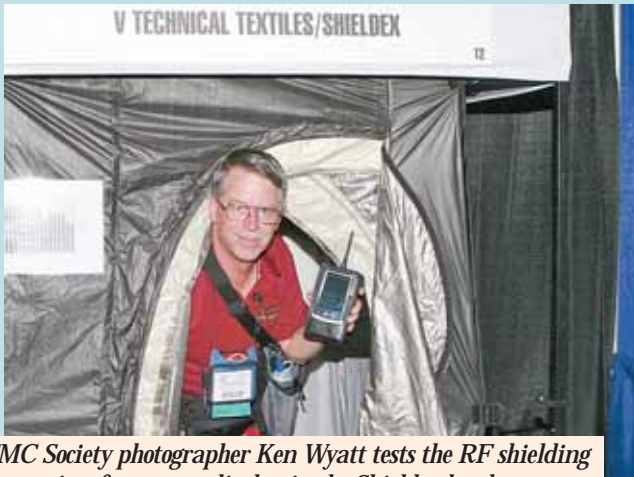

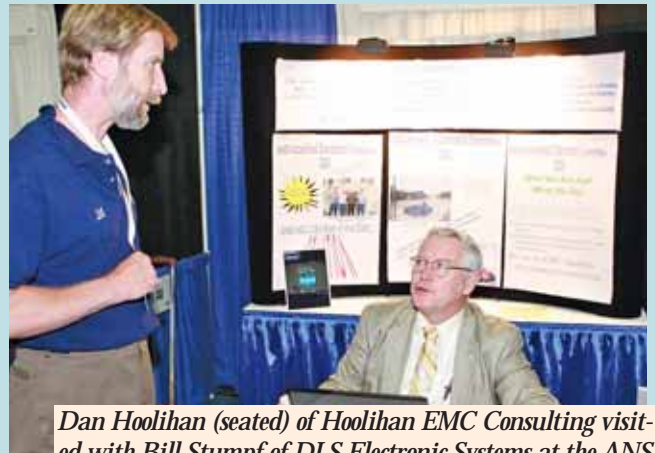

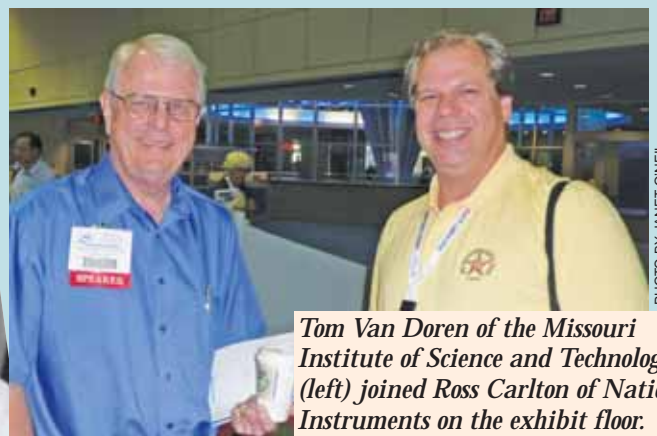

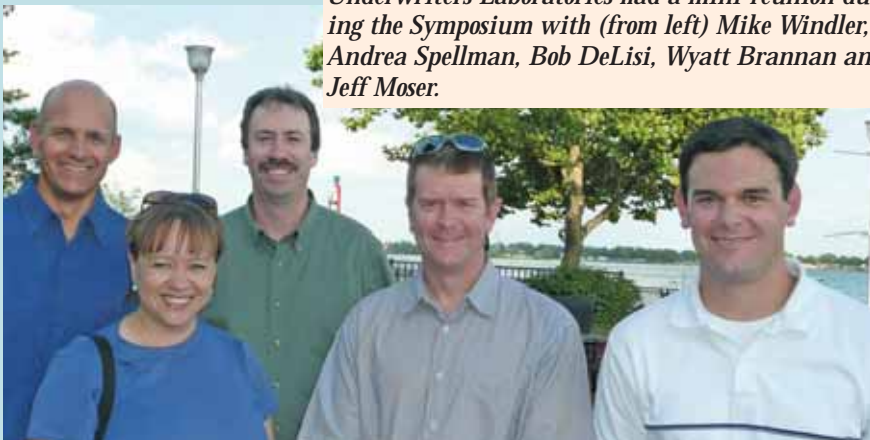

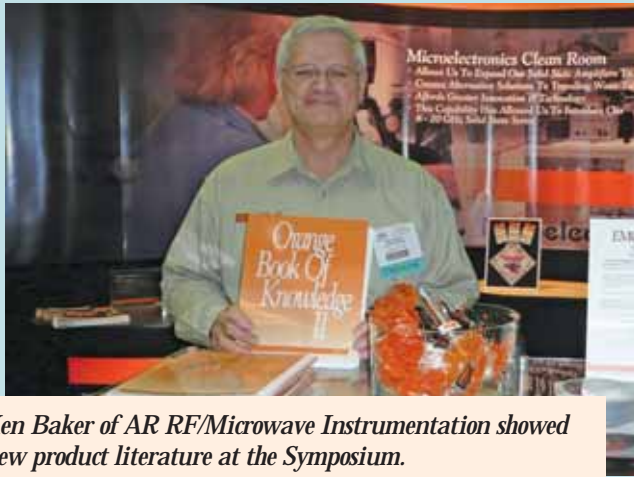
